List of recent winning academic scholarship recipients' projects:

2015 (Fall) – the fall scholarship was received by a professor at Montclair University, NJ, for studies in Sweden of Swedish teaching techniques, focusing on multicultural aspects.

2015 (Spring) – the spring scholarship was awarded to two recipients. One part of scholarship was awarded to a student at Vassar College towards studies in Stockholm of “Media, Gender, and Language in Swedish society”, as well as internship with the Stockholm International Film Festival. Other part of the scholarship was awarded to a NJ based musician, towards recording of Nordic organ music, including performance on the new organ at Kalmar Cathedral.

2014 (Fall) – no scholarship awarded

2014 (Spring) – the scholarship was received by a student at Montclair University, NJ, for studies at Kristianstad University, an exchange program supported by SWEA New Jersey.

2013 (Fall) – the fall 2013 award was received by a psychology major that will research how preschool education forms a platform for society to socialize norms centered around the importance of the group versus the individual and the trade-off between personal benefit and the large common good of society/the community.

2013 (Spring) – the scholarship was awarded to a Juilliard-trained guitarist that will use the award to create new arrangements of Swedish folk songs for guitar, and through these arrangements hopes to bring this music, as well as awareness of our culture, to a wide international audience.

2012 – the scholarship was awarded to a student from New Jersey, enrolled in the International Master Program in Ecotechnology and Sustainable Development at Mid Sweden University in Östersund-for a trip to Sundsvall and Umeå to view the works of architect Anders Nyquist and to compare differences in municipal plans in Sweden and USA.

2011 – the scholarship was awarded to a student from Minnesota enrolled in the Child Culture Design program at the University of Gothenburg to complete her masters project in Child furniture design.

2010 – no scholar ship was awarded.

2009 – Study in Sweden for a semester to research immigrant experiences and to compare them with immigrant experiences in the USA in order to improve those experiences in the future.

2008 (half scholarship) – Produce a multi-channel film and video installation that

explores the historical and contemporary significance of the Swedish entrepreneur, financier, and industrialist Ivar Kreuger (1880-1932).

2008 (half scholarship) – Complete a dissertation about Sweden’s black arts books.

2007 (half scholarship) – Produce and perform a show about one of Sweden’s biggest and most controversial stars ever: Zarah Leander.

2007 (half scholarship) – Attend summer courses at two Swedish folk high schools to study Swedish literature, language and culture.

2006 – Travel to Sweden to capture the Swedish society on paper through illustrations, words and photography.

2005 – Develop a Scandinavian song recital.
